
CUBA PERFINS---

Perfins from Cuba? Yes, they do exist. Recently we have located two Cuban stamps that are perforated with different letters. One shows N/C/B and the other SA/RRA. The big questions now are: 1) What do - - these letters stand for? 2) What organizations utilized these perfins? and 3) When and were they used and the reason?

The stamps on which these perforated inicials have been found are: N/C/B on the 10c Estrada Palma brown, typr of 1917 issue (Scott 307), and the SA/RRA on the 3c dark brown (Mangos de Baragua) Scott 312.



S A RRA On the 10c Estrada Palma stamp all the letters are 5 holes in height, with the holes having a diameter of 1 milimeter. Each letter is about 7 mm. high, and 4 mm. wide and are diagonal up.

On the 3c Mangos stamp the letters are 4 holes in height, with the diameter on the holes being 1 mm. The letters are about 5 mm high and 4 mm wide. The distance between the S and A is 2 mm, and the distance between the R's and the A are 1 mm each. It seems to us that SA/RRA stands for a well known name in Pre-Castro's Cuba. Sarra was the name of a big drug wholesale and retail firm in Havana.

Perfins are normally applied to stamps to discourage theft, with agreement with the Post Office concerned. They are only usable on material mai-led by the person or firm whom the initials represent. While uninformed collectors whose interest lies only in stamps, discard a perfin as a "damage" stamp, these unusual items find a very warm - welcome whenever they fall into the hands of a -- specialist collector.


Not all perforated stamps are true perfins in the philatelic sense and perforating machines are sometimes used to cancel stamps used on - documents for revenue purposes.
