## Two Unusual Revenue Uses of Perfins on Cuban Postage Stamps Robert Littrell (#3992)

I have run across two revenue uses of perfins in Cuban postage stamps that to me are scarce, if not unique. The first is a conventional perfin postage stamp of the company Droguería Sarrá (SA/RRA) shown in Figure 1.

Nine definitive stamps (1¢ Martí, 5¢ García and 10¢ Palma) are used as revenue stamps on this Boletín de Expedición to pay customs of 67 centavos on a shipment of drugs to France, circa 1925.

The second revenue usage of a postage stamp of current usage is on a Tarjeta de Identificacion (Identification Card) shown in Figure 2 on page 127. The government agency originating this punch was the Cuban Department of Posts, making it an "Official Punch." The punch itself was "T DE I" (an abbreviation for Tarjeta de Identificacion). The punch tied the stamp to the ID card and voided it for further use. In this case only the letters "E I" perforated the stamp. The stamp was a ten centavos mapita (little map of Cuba) classic definitive issue of

1915. The stamp was also currently being used for regular postage at the time of this revenue usage. A hand cancellation shows the date of use being 23 March 1917. A dapper photograph of a gentleman named Pedro Bilbao has a ribbon through it and a seal to prevent tampering. The ID card is on heavy card stock paper with printed matter on the back side. The card folds in half.

Incidentally, this same series of mapitas was subsequently demonetized on 1 September 1917, overprinted, and thenceforth used as Timbre

One of my Cuban philatelic friends told me, "That isn't a 'real' perfin." The Perfins Club definition of an "official" punch is "a perfin used by a government agency." It also defines "perfin cancel" as "where a perfin is used to cancel a stamp (usually revenue) or a document." And it certainly fits the definition of a "perfin," that being "perforated initials or insignia." So I respectfully disagreed with him.
