

CUBAN PERFINs

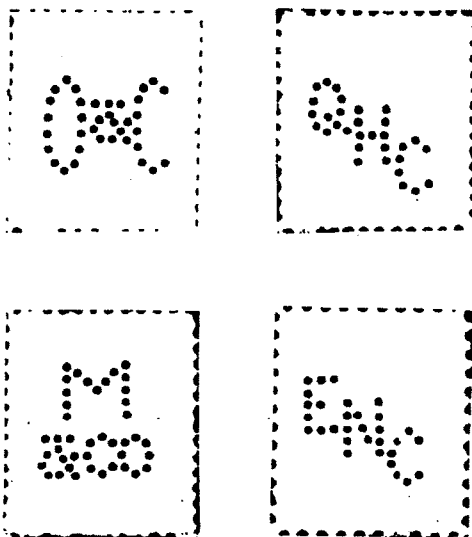

The article in the last issue of the bulletin listed twelve types of Perfin found on Cuban stamps. Since then, further research has resulted in positive identification of three, tentative identification of three, and the discovery of four additional types, for a total of sixteen types.

The positive identifications are made from covers. N/C/B is The National City Bank of New York, Havana Branch. RV/&Co. is Cultural, S.A. SA/RRR is DROGUERIA SARRA, a drug firm in Havana.

The tentative identifications are: B/N/C — Banco Nacional de Cuba; DUN — Dun and Bradstreet; and PD — Parke-Davis, a drug firm. The latter two identifications were from the U.S. Perfin Catalogue.

The four new types discovered are: O&C; Q/H/C; M/&Co.; and E/N/C.



As you can see, very few are now positively identified. Your help is needed! The author is researching this area as well as the perfin of all Latin America in order to publish a catalogue. If you have any information about perfin in these areas, please contact the author. If you have covers with perfin on them or any information regarding Cuban perfin, please write or send
