At noon on May 20, 1902, the United States Military Governor of Cuba, General Leonard Wood, personally read President Theodore Roosevelt's letter declaring that the U.S. occupation was at an end. At the same time, Mr. M.C. Fosnes, Director General of Posts for the U.S. administration turned over all of the postal affairs to Col. Fernando Figueredo Socarrás, first postmaster general of Cuba. The U.S. flag was lowered in Havana and the Cuban flag was raised.
